July 5-11 - Dr Kimberly Nicholas @KA_Nicholas

Kimberly Nicholas, Associate Professor of Sustainability Science at the Lund University Centre for Sustainability Studies (LUCSUS), Lund, Sweden. Kimberly teaches in the Lund University International Master's Programme in Environmental Studies and Sustainability Science (LUMES), and also mentors PhD students. Kimberly's research focuses on what human changes to the Earth's climate and land surface will mean for the future of the ecosystems on which we depend, and how we can better balance human needs with sustaining the planet's life support systems.

July 12-18 - Dr Gavin Schmidt @ClimateOfGavin

Gavin Schmidt, Director of GISS and Principal Investigator for the GISS Model E Earth System Model, is interested in understanding past, present and future climate and the impacts of multiple drivers of climate change, including solar irradiance, atmospheric chemistry, aerosols, and greenhouse gases. Gavin does a lot of outreach, giving TED talks, participating in documentaries, and even making appearances on late night talk shows.

July 19-25 - Dr Corey Bradshaw @conservbytes

Corey Bradshaw, Sir Hubert Wilkins Chair of Climate Change and director of The Environment Institute's Climate and Ecology Centre and the School of Biological Sciences' Global Change Ecology Lab at the University of Adelaide. Corey has a broad range of research interests including population dynamics, extinction theory, palaeo-ecology, sustainability, invasion biology, community ecology, and climate change impacts & mitigation.

July 26- Aug 1 - Dr Michael SanClemens @msanclem

Mike SanClements, deputy director at The National Ecological Observatory Network (NEON) and affiliate faculty at the Institute of Arctic and Alpine Research, University of Colorado Boulder. Mike is a biogeochemist focused on forested systems and their associated waters. He dabbles in journalism and has written for Dot Earth, Grist, BuzzFeed, Common Dreams, Huffpo (coming soon), and Backpacker. He has also written the book “Plastic purge” (St. Martin's Press).
